Washington Puzzle Quilt©

Block Size: 8-1/2" finished
4 x 5 Blocks = 58" x 68" quilt
4 x 4 Blocks makes a smaller quilt

All instructions and patterns for this quilt are supplied. Students will learn how to stack 10-1/2" precut squares in piles of 9 and slice the patches without any templates. There are no bias edges along the outside - the magic is in the cutting! Must have a good relationship with your sewing machine. All sewing is straight-line sewing. Please practice your 1/4" seams if you are unsure of how your sewing machine performs.

Fabric Requirements

At least twenty (20) 10-1/2" squares (batiks, other prints with good contrast)

1 yard black (or any other color of preference) for sashings

1-3/4 yard border print for quilt as shown

6" x 12" ruler (or 6" x 24"); also, either a 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" square ruler

One or two pieces of freezer paper 10-1/2" square (I will have some on hand)

Sewing machine (one that you are familiar with) - don't bring a new machine you've never sewn on

Rotary cutting tools - Put a new blade in your rotary cutter (45mm or 60mm size)

Basic sewing supplies

Optional, but very helpful: Revolving rotary cutting mat

15 - 20 pieces of 8-1/2" x 11" paper (for separating blocks once they are cut). Any paper will do, even if it has writing on it (an advertisement, etc) or notebook paper.

If you can bring a clean, empty pizza box, it will help keep your block parts in order.
