



Pyramids and Jewels - Two quilts, two techniques by Debby Kratovil

This Thousand Pyramids quilt of Debby's appeared in the Summer 2014 issue of Modern Patchwork Magazine. She squeezed every single bit of fabric from her pack of Kona solid charm squares. To her delight, she had the makings for a second quilt when she carefully cut out her first quilt.



#### Materials for Thousand Pyramids Quilt

Finished size: 21" x 22-1/2"

5" Charm Pack of at least 43 squares (colors can be repeated)

3/4 yard Kona Snow (or other light solid); precut this into six (6) strips 3-1/2" x wof.

60 degree multi-sized ruler

#### Pattern fee:

\$12 for both patterns (not each)

\$10 for multi-sized 60 degree ruler if you don't have one. I will have several for purchase.

#### Materials for Fractured Jewels Quilt

Finished size without border: 27" x 34"

1/2 yard Kona Snow or other light solid fabric; do not precut  
Extra strips of solid fabrics or scraps at least 3-1/2" x 5"

60 degree multi-sized ruler

You can create your own "Charm Pack". Just cut a variety of 5" squares from a wide assortment of solids or batiks. Note that the light background fabric can be anything that will give you good contrast. For the Thousand Pyramids quilt, we will need at least 40 of the 43 charms. I did incorporate a few of my own solids from my stash for the second quilt.

Please bring all fabrics! Also, you will need your standard cutting mats, rotary cutters and other rulers (ie, 6" x 12" ruler)
